HISTORICAL CONTEXT OF FREUD'S WORK

RELIGION AS A CULTURAL PHENOMENON

FURTHERMORE, FREUD VIEWS RELIGION AS A CULTURAL PRODUCT THAT EVOLVES TO MEET THE PSYCHOLOGICAL NEEDS OF SOCIETY. HE ASSERTS THAT AS CIVILIZATION PROGRESSES AND INDIVIDUALS BECOME MORE AWARE OF THE NATURAL WORLD, THE NEED FOR RELIGIOUS ILLUSIONS DIMINISHES. THE PSYCHOLOGICAL PERSPECTIVE ON RELIGION

THE ROLE OF GUILT AND FEAR

IN FREUD'S VIEW, FEELINGS OF GUILT AND FEAR ARE CENTRAL TO THE HUMAN EXPERIENCE. RELIGION OFTEN EXPLOITS THESE EMOTIONS TO MAINTAIN CONTROL OVER INDIVIDUALS AND SOCIETIES. FREUD ARGUES THAT THIS PSYCHOLOGICAL MANIPULATION IS A KEY REASON WHY INDIVIDUALS CLING TO RELIGIOUS BELIEFS, DESPITE THEIR ILLUSORY NATURE.

CRITIQUE OF FREUD'S ARGUMENTS

DESPITE ITS INSIGHTFUL ANALYSIS, FREUD'S "THE FUTURE OF AN ILLUSION" HAS FACED SUBSTANTIAL CRITIQUE FROM VARIOUS SCHOLARS AND THEOLOGIAN.
