HISTORY AND PHILOSOPHY OF SOCIAL WORK IS A MULTIFACETED FIELD THAT INTERTWINES RICH HISTORICAL ROOTS WITH PROFOUND PHILOSOPHICAL UNDERPINNINGS. - THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF SOCIAL WORKERS (NASW) IN 1955, WHICH PROVIDED A UNIFIED VOICE FOR SOCIAL WORKERS IN THE UNITED STATES.
- THE ENACTMENT OF SOCIAL WELFARE POLICIES, SUCH AS THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACT OF 1935, WHICH REFLECTED THE GROWING RECOGNITION OF THE GOVERNMENT'S ROLE IN SUPPORTING VULNERABLE POPULATIONS.

- **IMPORTANCE OF HUMAN RELATIONSHIPS:** BUILDING SUPPORTIVE RELATIONSHIPS IS ESSENTIAL FOR PERSONAL GROWTH AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT.
- **INTEGRITY:** SOCIAL WORKERS MUST PRACTICE HONESTLY AND TRANSPARENTLY IN THEIR PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT.
- **COMPETENCE:** CONTINUOUS PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT IS NECESSARY TO PROVIDE EFFECTIVE SERVICES.

THESE VALUES NOT ONLY INFORM THE PRACTICE OF SOCIAL WORK BUT ALSO REFLECT THE ETHICAL OBLIGATIONS THAT PRACTITIONERS MUST UPHOLD IN THEIR INTERACTIONS WITH CLIENTS AND COMMUNITIES.

THE ROLE OF ETHICS IN SOCIAL WORK

ETHICS PLAY A CRUCIAL ROLE IN GUIDING SOCIAL WORK PRACTICE. THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF SOCIAL WORKERS HAS ESTABLISHED A CODE OF ETHICS THAT OUTLINES THE ETHICAL PRINCIPLES AND STANDARDS THAT SOCIAL WORKERS ARE EXPECTED TO ADHERE TO. THIS CODE SERVES AS A FOUNDATION FOR ETHICAL DECISION-MAKING AND PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT. KEY ETHICAL PRINCIPLES INCLUDE:

- RESPECT FOR THE INHERENT DIGNITY AND WORTH OF EACH PERSON.
- COMMITMENT TO SOCIAL JUSTICE AND ADVOCACY FOR VULNERABLE POPULATIONS.
- MAINTAINING CONFIDENTIALITY AND SAFEGUARDING CLIENT PRIVACY.

- PROMOTING THE WELL-BEING OF CLIENTS AND COMMUNITIES.
- ENGAGING IN CULTURALLY COMPETENT PRACTICE THAT RESPECTS DIVERSE BACKGROUNDS.

ETHICAL DILEMMAS ARE COMMON IN SOCIAL WORK, PARTICULARLY WHEN BALANCING THE NEEDS OF CLIENTS WITH AGENCY POLICIES OR LEGAL REQUIREMENTS.
