CONFLICT THEORY, CONVERSELY, EMPHASIZES SOCIAL INEQUALITIES THAT PRODUCE CONFLICT AND CHANGE. SYMBOLIC INTERACTIONISM FOCUSES ON THE MICRO-LEVEL INTERACTIONS BETWEEN INDIVIDUALS AND THE ROLE OF SYMBOLS IN CREATING MEANING. UNDERSTANDING THE TENETS, KEY PROponents, AND APPLICATIONS OF EACH OF THESE PERSPECTIVES IS VITAL.

CULTURE AND SOCIALIZATION

CULTURE ENCOMPASSES THE VALUES, BELIEFS, NORMS, BEHAVIORS, AND ARTIFACTS THAT CHARACTERIZE A GROUP OR SOCIETY. SOCIAL STRUCTURE AND INSTITUTIONS

SOCIAL STRUCTURE REFERS TO THE PATTERNED SOCIAL ARRANGEMENTS IN SOCIETY THAT ARE BOTH EMERGENT FROM AND DETERMINANT OF THE ACTIONS OF INDIVIDUALS. SOCIAL INSTITUTIONS ARE ESTABLISHED AND ENDURING PATTERNS OF SOCIAL RELATIONSHIPS THAT ORGANIZE AND DIRECT HUMAN BEHAVIOR IN FUNDAMENTAL WAYS. MAJOR SOCIAL INSTITUTIONS INCLUDE THE FAMILY, EDUCATION, RELIGION, ECONOMY, AND GOVERNMENT. UNDERSTANDING THE ROLES AND FUNCTIONS OF THESE INSTITUTIONS, AS WELL AS HOW THEY INTERACT AND INFLUENCE INDIVIDUALS AND SOCIETY, IS A CRITICAL COMPONENT OF THE EXAM. CONCEPTS LIKE SOCIAL STATUS, SOCIAL ROLES, AND SOCIAL GROUPS ARE ALSO CENTRAL HERE.

SOCIAL STRATIFICATION AND INEQUALITY

SOCIAL STRATIFICATION REFERS TO A SYSTEM BY WHICH A SOCIETY RANKS CATEGORIES OF PEOPLE IN A HIERARCHY. THIS HIERARCHY IS BASED ON FACTORS SUCH AS WEALTH, POWER, AND PRESTIGE. SOCIAL CHANGE AND MOVEMENTS

SOCIETIES ARE NOT STATIC; THEY ARE CONSTANTLY UNDERGOING PROCESSES OF CHANGE. SOCIAL CHANGE REFERS TO THE TRANSFORMATION OF CULTURE AND SOCIAL INSTITUTIONS OVER TIME. CREATE VISUAL DIAGRAMS THAT CONNECT KEY TERMS, THEORIES, AND THEORISTS. THIS HELPS YOU UNDERSTAND THE RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN DIFFERENT IDEAS AND PROVIDES A HOLISTIC VIEW OF SOCIOLOGICAL FRAMEWORKS. FOR INSTANCE, A CONCEPT MAP FOR "SOCIAL STRATIFICATION" COULD BRANCH OUT TO INCLUDE "CLASS," "STATUS," "POWER," "THEORIES OF STRATIFICATION," AND "FORMS OF INEQUALITY."

SIMULATING TEST CONDITIONS

THIS ALLOWS FOR TARGETED STUDY.

REVIEWING INCORRECT AND UNANSWERED QUESTIONS

APPROACHING DIFFICULT QUESTIONS

WHEN FACED WITH A DIFFICULT QUESTION, TRY TO ELIMINATE ANSWER CHOICES THAT ARE CLEARLY INCORRECT. THIS PROCESS OF ELIMINATION CAN SIGNIFICANTLY INCREASE YOUR ODDS OF SELECTING THE CORRECT ANSWER, EVEN IF YOU'RE NOT ENTIRELY CERTAIN. IF YOU'RE STILL UNSURE AFTER ELIMINATING SOME OPTIONS, TRY TO RECALL ANY RELEVANT THEORIES OR CONCEPTS THAT MIGHT APPLY. SOMETIMES, JUST REMEMBERING A KEY TERM OR A THEORIST'S NAME CAN HELP YOU ORIENT YOURSELF AND MAKE A MORE INFORMED DECISION. TRUST YOUR PREPARATION AND THE KNOWLEDGE YOU'VE ACQUIRED.

STAYING CALM AND FOCUSED

TEST ANXIETY CAN BE A SIGNIFICANT IMPEDIMENT TO PERFORMANCE. ON TEST DAY, TRY TO REMAIN CALM AND FOCUSED. TAKE DEEP BREATHS IF YOU FEEL OVERWHELMED. REMIND YOURSELF OF THE EXTENSIVE PREPARATION YOU HAVE UNDERTAKEN. POSITIVE SELF-TALK CAN BE BENEFICIAL. TRUST IN YOUR ABILITIES AND YOUR KNOWLEDGE. A CLEAR AND COMPOSED MIND WILL ALLOW YOU TO PROCESS INFORMATION MORE EFFECTIVELY AND MAKE BETTER DECISIONS UNDER PRESSURE.
